[NCCI \(all other states\)](#)      Payroll associated with WSEs paid but not working will not be considered for premium calc purposes. Allowing reclassification for WSEs working in a different role(8810 / 8871), WSE Lives in Mono state/ works in NCCI state – which laws take president (leaving up to Mono state), Continuing to evaluate if Covid claims will be considered for experience rating purposes. <a href="#">New Jersey</a>	Bulletin <a href="#">20-04</a> Encourages insurers to relax due dates for premium payments, extending grace periods and allow for forbearance with regards to cancellations/non-renewals of policies.
<a href="#">New York</a>	Executive Order <a href="#">202.13</a> Moratorium on cancelling, non-renewing, or conditionally renewing workers compensation policies for 60 days as of 4/1/2020.
<a href="#">North Carolina</a>	None  Calls for the deferred payments of premium through 6/30/20, presumption for WC coverage for first responders, and certain health care workers <a href="#">Executive Order 2020-12 First Responders, Health Care Workers</a> . <b>Are employees who contract COVID-19 eligible for workers' compensation benefits?</b>
<a href="#">North Dakota</a>	No. Diseases to which the general public outside of employment are exposed are specifically excluded from workers' compensation coverage in North Dakota. COVID-19 fits into this exclusion. Even though it may be contended an employee contracted COVID-19 while working, the employee is not eligible for workers' compensation benefits for this type of illness. <a href="#">Covid 19 FAQ - Exec Order 2020-15</a>
<a href="#">Ohio</a>	Allows for the deferred payments of premium until 6/1/20 including PEO deferments of payments for March and April until 6/1/20, and May payrolls to 6/15/20.
